Matthew 4:1-11

The Temptation of Jesus

4 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.² And after He had fasted for forty days and forty nights, He then became hungry.³ And the tempter came and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread." ⁴ But He answered and said, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes out of the mouth of God.'"

⁵ Then the devil *took Him along into the holy city and had Him stand on the pinnacle of the temple, ⁶ and he *said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down; for it is written:

'He will give His angels orders concerning You';

and

'On their hands they will lift You up, So that You do not strike Your foot against a stone.'"

⁷ Jesus said to him, "[b]On the other hand, it is written: 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.'"
